



Division 2 Players Info

The complete BC-CWBL League rules can be found online at www.bcwbs.ca. Please take time to be familiar with the rules as they might affect you and your team.

<UNIFORMS>

If a player does not wear an appropriate uniform, he/she will NOT be allowed to play the game. This is enforced by the game referee/official at his/her discretion.

- Your team members need to wear jerseys with the same design/color and with a number between 0-99 (although 4-15 is ideal), that is NOT duplicated with other players' numbers on the team.
- Uniform bottoms must match in color among players on the team. We recommend everyone to wear black as it's the easiest way to match.
- The color of a t-shirt worn under the uniform must match with the color of the uniform.

<PENALTIES>

Your commitment is important to your team. Please note that there will be penalties charged for:

- Your team withdrawing from the tournament, which it once committed to, later than 5 weeks prior to the scheduled tournament date - \$250
- Your team missing an assigned table officials' duty (you MUST be at the table at latest 10 min prior to the game starting time) - \$25 per spot

* Forfeit: In case of forfeit, your team is responsible to report to the game's head official as well as the game director about your forfeit and its reason as soon as possible. Teams are strongly encouraged to play the game with their best effort, for example by borrowing players from other teams or modifying players' number, etc.
